AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 129 OF THE CIVIL
CODE OF GUAM TO PROVIDE FOR A PRESUMPTION
OF RESIDENCE.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 129 of the Civil Code of Guam is hereby
3 amended to read as follows:

4 "§ 129. Residence, proof required. In actions
5 for dissolution of marriage neither the domicile nor
6 residence of the husband shall be deemed to be the
7 domicile or residence of the wife. For the purposes
8 of such an action each may have a separate domicile
9 or residence depending upon proof of the fact and not
10 upon legal presumptions. Physical presence in Guam
11 for one year next preceding the commencement of the
12 action shall give rise to a presumption of residence
13 required by Section 128 of this code."

14 Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
