AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 129 OF THE CIVIL CODE OF GUAN TO PROVIDE FOR A PRESUMPTION OF RESIDENCE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 129 of the Civil Code of Guam is hereby

smended to read as follows:

"§ 129. Residence, proof required. In actions for dissolution of marriage neither the domicile nor residence of the husband shall be deemed to be the domicile or residence of the wife. For the purposes of such an action each may have a separate domicile or residence depending upon proof of the fact and not upon legal presumptions. Physical presence in Guerra for one year next preceding the commencement of the action shall give rise to a presumption of residence required by Section 128 of this code."

Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
