BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. The monies appropriated in Public Law 5-93 and Public Law 6-9 for the purpose of establishing a Court Housing Fund are hereby reappropriated, in accordance with the provisions contained in those laws, in the entire amount of the Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) for the purpose of constructing courthouse facilities.
