AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 9701.2. 9701.6 AND 9701.7 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM PERTAINING TO THE ESTABLISHMENT OF CEMETERIES AND TO AMEND SUBSECTION (a) OF SECTION 19301 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO EXEMPT OWNERS OF CEMETERY LOTS OR PLOTS FROM REAL ESTATE TAXATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAR:

Section 1. Section 9701.2 of the Government Code of Guam is bereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 9701.2. Location. No senotery, or other place of burial, public or private, shall be located or established so as to endanger any potable water supply, nor within one hundred (100) feet of any spring, well, lake, pend or stream, nor in any place except with the approval of the Director; provided, however, that with the Director's approval, a burial lot or plot may be located within not less than twenty-five (25) feet of such spring, well, lake, pend or stream where a concrete or steel wakt is used to contain the body in such burial lot or plot."

Section 2. Section 9701.6 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 9701.6. One Body per Grave. Only one (1) body shall be buried in each grave, except that with the approval of the Director, companion concrete or steel laws crypts as defined by the Director may be used for the burial of more than one (1) body in each grave."

Section 3. Section 9701.7 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby smended to read as follows:

"Section 9701.7. Grave Standards. Grave shall be not less than six (6) feet in depth below the surface level of

the adjoining ground, and shall be one (1) foot larger in width and length than the coffin; provided, however, that where concrete or steel waults are used to contain the body, the grave shall be not less than eighteen (18) inches in depth below the surface level of the adjoining ground,"

Section 4. Subsection (a) of Section 19301 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 19301. Definitions. Unless the context otherwise requires, the following provisions shall govern the construction of this Chapter:

(a) 'Property' means land and improvements on land, but shall not include land used exclusively as a cometery or a ground, plot or lot for burying the dead, except when such land is held by a person, firm or corporation with a view to profit or for the purpose of speculating in the sale thereof, and such a lot in any cometery, not suned for profit or speculation, shall be exempt from levy or execution."

Section 5. This Act is an urgency measure.
