AN ACT TO ENACT A NEW CHAPTER 11 TO TITLE KIV OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAR RELATIVE TO PRIORITIES, TEMPORARY HOUSING AND DEVELOPMENT OF GOVERNMENT SUBDIVISIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUARI

Section 1. A new Chapter 11 is hereby added to Title XIV of the Government Code of Guam to read as follows:

"CHAPTER 11

Land Development

Section 13950. Designation: acquisition.

The Governor is authorized to designate land in, adjacent to or near any willage for the purpose of developing the same for either temperary or permanent residential purposes. Government real property may be used for this purpose or privately owned land may be acquired by lease, purchase, exchange or by condemnation.

approval of the Governor, may lease privately-owned land in, adjacent to or near any village for the purpose of temporarily providing housing or space for the erection of temporary housing. Such housing may be erected by the Government through its own departments and agencies or through private contractors or the same may be erected by the Federal Government. Any such housing may be leased to any person upon such uniform terms and conditions as the Director, with the approval of the Governor and the concurrence of a majority of the members of the Committee on Public Works of the Legislature, may establish. The provisions of Chapter 6 of this Title specifically do not apply to leases or leasees herounder.

Section 13952. Secenment subdivisions. The Directic, with the approval of the Governor, may designate and plan subdivisions in general conformity with the provisions of Title XIX, Government Code of Guan, in adjacent to or mear any willage. Government real property may be used for this purpose or privately owned property may be acquired by purchase, exchange or condomnation. The Department of Public Norks shall be responsible for the construction of the necessary improvements of any such subdivisions. The Department of Public Works may perform the necessary work and construction therefor, or may contract for such work and construction in whole or in part with private contractors upon the basis of competitive bidding.

Section 13953. Housing: Construction, On a government subdivision, heretofore or hereafter designated, houses conforming to the Federal Housing Authority and the Veterans Administration specifications, may be constructed. Plans and specifications for such houses may be prepared by the Department of Public Works or such agency, officer or consultant as the Governor may designate and any such plans and specifications shall be subject to the approval of the Governor. Construction of such houses may be performed by the Government or may be let by contract to the lowest responsible bidder.

Section 13954. Housing: sale. Houses, constructed hereunder, shall be sold as provided for in Chapter 6 of this Title.

Section 13955, Federal grants or assistance.

The Governor is authorized to accept grants or assistance from the Federal Government or any other public or private source to carry out the purposes and intent of this Chapter."
