

AN ACT TO AMEND SUBSECTION (7) OF SECTION
20002 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM
RELATING TO THE ADMISSION TO PRACTICE LAW
IN THE TERRITORY OF GUAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Subsection (7) of Section 20002 of the Government
Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(7) He shall have either

(a) graduated from a law school accredited by the American
Bar Association, or

(b) studied law diligently and in good faith for a period of at
least ten (10) years in the office and under the preceptorship
of a locally-admitted attorney (which attorney must have
graduated from a law school accredited by the American Bar
Association) and been actually employed full time by such
attorney and satisfactorily passed a written examination in law
given by the committee of examiners."

Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
