AN ACT TO ADD SECTION 403 TO THE PENAL CODE OF GUAM TO PROHIBIT ANY PERSON FROM ABANDONING OE DISCARDING REFRIGERATORS IN ANY PLACE ACCESSIBLE TO CHILDREN WITHOUT THE HINGES BEING REMOVED.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. Section 403 is hereby added to the Penal Code of Guam to read as follows:

> "Section 403. Abandoned Refrigerator to Have Hinges Removed. Anyone who abandons, discards, stores, or keeps in any place accessible to children, or who, as the owner, lessee, or manager, permits to remain on premises under his control, a refrigerator, icebox, freezer cabinet. or similar container, of a capacity of one and one-half cubic feet. or more, which is no longer used for refrigeration purposes, without the attached doors, hinges, lids or hatches being removed, is guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by fine of not more than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00). or by imprisonment for not more than thirty (30) days, or both. Guilt of a violation of this section shall not, in itself, render one guilty of manslaughter, battery or other erime against a person who may suffer death or injury from entrapment in such refrigerator. icebox, or deep freeze locker.

The provisions of this section shall not apply to any vendor or seller of refrigerators, iceboxes, or deep freeze lockers, who keeps or stores them for sale purposes, if the vendor or seller takes reasonable precautions to effectively secure the door of any such refrigerator, icebox, or deep freeze locker so as to prevent entrance by children small enough to fit therein."

Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
