


CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR

AN ACT TO ADD SECTION 403 TO THE PENAL CODE
OF GUAM TO PROHIBIT ANY PERSON FROM ABANDONING
OR DISCARDING REFRIGERATORS IN ANY PLACE ACCESSIBLE
TO CHILDREN WITHOUT THE HINGES BEING REMOVED.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 403 is hereby added to the Penal Code of Guam
3 to read as follows:

4 "Section 403. Abandoned Refrigerator to Have
5 Hinges Removed. Anyone who abandons, discards, stores,
6 or keeps in any place accessible to children, or who, as
7 the owner, lessee, or manager, permits to remain on premises
8 under his control, a refrigerator, icebox, freezer cabinet,
9 or similar container, of a capacity of one and one-half
10 cubic feet, or more, which is no longer used for refrigeration
11 purposes, without the attached doors, hinges, lids or
12 hatches being removed, is guilty of a misdemeanor and
13 shall be punished by fine of not more than Fifty Dollars
14 (\$50.00), or by imprisonment for not more than thirty (30)
15 days, or both. Guilt of a violation of this section shall
16 not, in itself, render one guilty of manslaughter, battery
17 or other crime against a person who may suffer death or
18 injury from entrapment in such refrigerator, icebox, or
19 deep freeze locker.

20 The provisions of this section shall not apply to
21 any vendor or seller of refrigerators, iceboxes, or deep
22 freeze lockers, who keeps or stores them for sale purposes,
23 if the vendor or seller takes reasonable precautions to
24 effectively secure the door of any such refrigerator, icebox,
25 or deep freeze locker so as to prevent entrance by children
26 small enough to fit therein."

27 Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
