AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 11803 AND 11810
OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO CLARIFY
THE TRANSPORTATION PRIVILEGES OF THOSE
STUDENTS GRANTED TERRITORIAL SCHOLARSHIP.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 11803 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby
amended to read as follows:

"Section 11803. Students entitled to Scholarship:
Amount of Scholarship. In order to encourage attendance
of high school graduates at the College of Guam, and to
recognize superior scholarship and to encourage the develop-
ment of other outstanding qualities, two college students in
each annual graduating class of the College of Guam are hereby
provided scholarships in an amount which shall reasonably
cover the cost of room and board, books, tuition and other
college fees, as annually determined by the Board, in an
accredited institution within the United States or its
territories and which has been approved by the Faculty of
the College of Guam, for a period of two years next
succeeding the year of graduation. Any student hereunder
shall be entitled a grant to cover the cost of initial
transportation to the institution and thereafter he shall
be entitled to the travel and transportation privileges
set forth in Section 4110.1 of this Code upon the completion
of his studies. Students shall be selected on the basis of
scholarship, aptitude, interest, health, personality,
ambition and other criteria consistent with the purposes
of this subchapter. To be eligible for consideration for
the scholarship a student must be a United States citizen
and must have established his residence in Guam for a
period of at least two years immediately preceding his

1 application, and must have a cumulative grade-point
2 average of 'B' or better upon graduation from the College
3 of Guam. Selection shall be made by the Faculty of the
4 College or a Committee thereof."

5 Section 2. Section 11810 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby
6 amended to read as follows:

7 "Section 11810. Same: Amount. The scholarship
8 herein provided shall be in an amount which shall reasonably
9 cover the cost of room and board, books, tuition and other
10 school fees, as annually determined by the Board, for the
11 period which the recipient needs to complete the requirements
12 for the degree or certificate issued upon graduation by the
13 schools or institutions attended: Provided that such period
14 be no longer than the usual period for the fulfilling of
15 the requirements for the said degree or certificate by a
16 student not having the scholarship herein provided but
17 similarly enrolled in the same school or institution. Any
18 student hereunder shall be entitled a grant to cover the
19 cost of initial transportation to the institution and
20 thereafter he shall be entitled to the travel and transportation
21 privileges set forth in Section 4110.1 of this Code upon
22 the completion of his studies."

23 Section 3. This Act is an urgency measure.
