AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 11803 AND 11810 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAR TO CLARIFY THE TRANSPORTATION PRIVILEGES OF THOSE STUDENTS GRANTED TERRITORIAL SCHOLARSHIP.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAR:

Section 1. Section 11803 of the Government Code of Guem is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 11803. Students entitled to Scholarship: Amount of Scholarship. In order to encourage attendance of high school graduates at the College of Guan, and to recognize superior scholarship and to encourage the development of other outstanding qualities, two college students in each annual graduating class of the College of Guam are hereby provided scholarships in an amount which shall reasonably cover the cost of room and board, books, tuition and other college fees, as annually determined by the Board, in an accredited institution within the United States or its territories and which has been approved by the Faculty of the College of Guam, for a period of two years next succeeding the year of graduation. Any student hereunder shall be entitled a grant to cover the cost of initial transportation to the institution and thereafter he shall be entitled to the travel and transportation privileges set forth in Section 4110.1 of this Code upon the completion of his studies. Students shall be selected on the basis of scholarship, aptitude, interest, health, personality, ambition and other criteria consistent with the purposes of this subchapter. To be eligible for consideration for the scholarship a student must be a United States citizen and must have established his residence in Guam for a period of at least two years immediately preceding his

application, and must have a cumulative grade-point average of "B" or better upon graduation from the College of Guam. Selection shall be made by the Faculty of the College or a Committee thereof."

Section 2. Section 11810 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 11810. Same: Amount. The scholarship herein provided shall be in an amount which shall reasonably cover the cost of room and board, books, tuition and other school fees, as annually determined by the Board, for the period which the recipient needs to complete the requirements for the degree or certificate issued upon graduation by the schools or institutions attended: Provided that such period be no longer than the usual period for the fulfilling of the requirements for the said degree or certificate by a student not having the scholarship herein provided but similarly enrolled in the same school or institution. Any student hereunder shall be entitled a grant to cover the cost of initial transportation to the institution and thereafter he shall be entitled to the travel and transportation privileges set forth in Section 4110.1 of this Code upon the completion of his studies."

Section 3. This Act is an argency measure.
