AN ACT TO APD SECTIONS 13956, 13956.1 AND 13956.2 TO CHAPTER 11. TITLE XIV. GOVERNMENT CODE OF GRAM. RELATIVE TO AUTHORIZING THE GOVERNOR TO CONVEY LAND AT LESS THAN FAIR MARKET VALUE FOR EDUSING DEVELOPMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAR:

Section 1. Section 13956 is hereby added to Chapter 11, Title ATV. Government Code of Guam. to read as follows:

"Section 13956. Housing Development. Statement of furposes. Escause of the extraordinary housing emergency created by the two consecutive grave natural disasters which devastated the territory of Guan during the years 1962 and 1963. the Legislature has determined that it is therefore necessary to utilize the public lands of the people of 6ses to the maximum extent possible in secting the needs of the sany rendered homeless by the two great typhoons. The Legislature accordingly borehy declares that its latent and purpose is esacting the following provision is to provide homes for the bomeless at lowest possible cost, with first consideration directed to those of Cuam rendered boscless as a result of the two sterms. with priority is the sward of contracts hereunder to be given to local firms and companies, and with the goal in mind of first utilizing those government lands near the inhabited villages and communities of the territory."

Section 2. Section 13956.1 is hereby added to the Government Code of Guam to read as follows:

"Section 12956.1. Same. Contracts by Governor. The

Governor is authorized, as hereinafter set forth, to enter into a contract or contracts with any person, partnership or corporation for the construction and crection of residential houses on a bid basis on government-owned real property for sale to the people of Guam. Such a contract may provide for sale of government-owned real property at less then fair market value in consideration of site development by such person, partnership or corporation including, but not limited to, readways, power and mater facilities, drainage, and other improvements. Houses constructed hereunder shall conform to Federal Housing Authority and Veterans Administration specifications as well as all applicable local laws on such projects. The contract or contracts shall include the price for which any such hoses shall be sold and such other and further provisions or conditions as may be proper in the discretion of the Governor. Frior to his execution of any contract hereunder, or of may modification thereof, the Governor shall first submit the same to the Cosmittee on Rules of the Legislature which shall have the right to approve or disapprove the same in whole or is part, and, if disapproved, valess said proposed contract or modification thereof is seended to seet the approval of said Committee, the same may not be executed by the Governor. The approval or disapproval of the Consittee on Rules bereunder shall be in the form of its resolution duly adopted, a certified copy of which resolution of approval must be attached to said contract or modification before the same may be deemed duly executed by the Governor."

Section 3. Section 13956.2 is hereby added to the Government Code of Guam to read as follows:

"Section 13956.2. Same: Expiration date. The authority granted to the Governor by Section 13956.1 of this Code shall expire June 30. 1966, and thereafter no such contracts may be entered into:

provided, however, that we such contract duly executed prior to such date small be affected by the lapse in the Governor's authority to execute the same."
