
CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR

AN ACT TO ADD CHAPTER 11 TO TITLE XII OF THE
GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO ESTABLISH ANNUAL
LEGISLATIVE SCHOLASTIC PRIZES.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Chapter 11 is hereby added to the Government Code of
3 Guam to read as follows:

4 "CHAPTER 11

5 ANNUAL LEGISLATIVE SCHOLASTIC PRIZES

6 Section 11900. Annual Legislative Scholastic Prizes:

7 Students in the College of Guam.

8 Section 11901. Same: Students in high schools.

9 Section 11902. Prize Committee.

10 Section 11903. Prize Ceremony.

11 Section 11900. Annual Legislative Scholastic Prizes. There are
12 hereby established annual legislative scholastic prizes for students at any
13 public or private college in Guam. The student with the highest grade average
14 in each class of the college is entitled annually to a prize selected by the
15 Prize Committee and the student with the second highest grade average in each
16 class is entitled annually to a second prize selected by the Prize Committee.
17 Recipients of such prizes shall have attended the college for the full
18 academic year in which their grade average is highest or second highest as
19 the case may be, and shall have been full time students thereat. In the
20 event two or more students have identical high grade averages, the Prize
21 Committee established in Section 11902 shall choose the winner on the basis
22 of aptitude, interest, health, personality and ambition.

23 Section 11901. Same: Students in high schools. There are hereby
24 established annual legislative scholastic prizes for students at the several
25 public and private high schools in Guam, now or hereafter established. Each
26 student in each of the senior, junior, sophomore and freshmen classes of such

1 high schools in the territory who achieves the highest grade average for the
2 academic year is entitled annually to a prize selected by the Prize
3 Committee and each student in each of the senior, junior, sophomore and
4 freshmen classes of such schools who achieves the second highest grade
5 average is entitled annually to a prize selected by the Prize Committee.
6 Recipients of such prizes shall have attended the high schools for the full
7 academic year in which their grade average is highest or second highest as
8 the case may be, and shall have been full time students thereat. In the
9 event two or more students have identical high grade averages, the Prize
10 Committee established in Section 11902 shall choose the winner on the basis
11 of aptitude, interest, health, personality and ambition.

12 Section 11902. Prize Committee. There is hereby established the
13 Prize Committee on the annual legislative scholastic prizes as established
14 in this chapter. Such committee shall consist of five members, including
15 a chairman, to be appointed by the Governor. The Prize Committee shall meet
16 annually on June 1st to determine the prizes and the recipients thereof.
17 The Director of Education shall serve ex officio as Secretary of the Committee
18 and, as such, shall establish the procedure whereby the students or the
19 schools on behalf of the students, may apply for the prizes.

20 Section 11903. Prize Ceremony. The Prize Committee shall inform
21 the Legislature of the prize winners, and, working in conjunction with the
22 Legislature, shall annually on the 15th of June hold an appropriate ceremony
23 for the award of such prizes at the Guam Legislature Building. Such
24 ceremony shall include appropriate honors for the occasion and at said
25 ceremony each prize winner shall receive, in addition to the prize awarded,
26 a suitable prize certificate, in a form approved by the Committee, and
27 signed by the Governor."
