
CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 11813, SUBCHAPTER D,  
CHAPTER 9, GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM, RELATIVE  
TO SCHOLARSHIPS AND STUDENT LOANS.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 11813 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby  
3 amended to read as follows:

4 "Section 11813. Student Loans. The Board is authorized to  
5 approve loans to qualified applicants for advanced education  
6 beyond the high school level which may be in an amount sufficient  
7 to reasonably cover all or any part of the cost of transportation,  
8 room and board, tuition and other required fees for a period of  
9 one academic year in an accredited college, university, or  
10 technical or trade school in the United States or its territories,  
11 provided that loans to students of the College of Guam shall not  
12 exceed two hundred and fifty dollars a year, and to students in  
13 institutions outside of Guam, the amount shall not exceed fifteen  
14 hundred dollars a year and in no case shall the total amount loaned  
15 exceed six thousand dollars. Notwithstanding any other provision  
16 of law, any full-time student, on regular status and having a grade  
17 average at time of application of not less than 'C', in financial  
18 need, and a bona fide resident of Guam, attending an accredited  
19 college, university or technical school in the United States or  
20 its territories, is deemed to be otherwise qualified to obtain a  
21 loan hereunder."

22 Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
