AN ACT TO ADD A NEW TITLE XLVIII TO THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM RELATIVE TO ESTABLISH-MENT OF THE ECONOMIC INCENTIVE COMMISSION.

BE IT SNACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. A new Title XLVIII is hereby added to the Government Code of Guam. to read as follows:

"TITLE XLVIII

Chapter I

Economic Incentive Commission

Section 49270. Commission. There is hereby established within the government of Guam the Economic Incentive Commission, bereinafter referred to as the Commission, which shall be composed of seven (7) members. Two (2) such members shall be chosen by the Legislature from among its members, two (2) shall be officers of the Executive Branch designated by the Governor, and three (3) shall be appointed by the Governor from the business community of Guam, subject to confirmation by the Legislature. Members of the Commission shall serve for a term of two (2) years and the Commission shall select its own Chairman from among its membership. Members of the Commission shall serve without compensation, but shall be reimbursed for reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties as certified by the Director of Commerce.

Section 49271. Duties. It shall be the duty of the Commission to maintain and foster a study of the economy of Guam and to devise means and steps whereby

said economy may be strengthened. The Commission shall be particularly interested in those measures that may be necessary or desirable to attract new industries and commerce to the island. The Commission shall report periodically to the Governor on the activities of the Commission and shall submit such recommendations as may be indicated.

Section 49272. Facilities. The Department of Commerce shall furnish logistic support, personnel and facilities that may be required to enable the Commissioner to perform its function.

Section 49273. Contracts. The Commission is authorized, with the consent of the Governor, and approval by the Legislature, to enter into contracts with persons, partnerships or corporations for the purpose of making surveys, studies and recommendations within the intent of this Title."

Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
