AN ACT TO ADD A NEW SECTION 25111 TO THE  
GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM RELATING TO THE  
EXPIRATION OF LIQUOR LICENSES.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 25111 is hereby added to the Government Code  
3 of Guam to read as follows:

4 "Section 25111. Same: same: Transfer or closing of  
5 business. Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 25110 of  
6 this Chapter, a general retail dealer's on-sale license and a  
7 general retail dealer's off-sale license shall expire one (1)  
8 year from the date of transfer from such a licensee to another  
9 person, or from the date such a licensee goes out of business,  
10 whether voluntarily or involuntarily, unless, the licensee or  
11 transferee thereof puts the license to use within such one (1)  
12 year period by actually engaging in the business of selling  
13 alcoholic beverages in the manner permitted by the license."

14 Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
