AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 11401 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAR TO PROVIDE THAT ANY PARENT OR GUARDIAN WHO FAILS TO SEND A CHILD UNDER HIS CUSTODY TO SCHOOL SHALL BE GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 11401 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 11401. Buty to Send Children to School.

Any parent, guardian or other person having control or charge of any child between the ages of six and sixteen years, not exempted under the provisions of this chapter, shall send the child to a public or private full time day school for the full time of which such schools are in session.

The Board of Education, upon recommendation of the Director of Education, is authorized to establish attendance areas within the public school system.

Any parent, guardian or other person having control or charge of any such child between the ages of six and sixteen years who fails to comply with the provisions of this section, unless excused or exempted therefrom, is guilty of a misdemeanor, and, is liable, for the first offense, to a fine of not more than Ten Bollars (\$10), or to imprisonment for not more than five (5) days. For each subsequent offense he is liable to a fine of not less than Ten Bollars (\$10), or more than Fifty Bollars (\$50), or to imprisonment for not less than five (5) days, nor more than twenty-five (25) days, or to both such fine and imprisonment."

Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
