AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 11401 OF THE GOVERNMENT
CODE OF GUAM TO PROVIDE THAT ANY PARENT OR GUARDIAN
WHO FAILS TO SEND A CHILD UNDER HIS CUSTODY TO SCHOOL
SHALL BE GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 11401 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby
3 amended to read as follows:

4 "Section 11401. Duty to Send Children to School.

5 Any parent, guardian or other person having control or charge
6 of any child between the ages of six and sixteen years, not
7 exempted under the provisions of this chapter, shall send the
8 child to a public or private full time day school for the full
9 time of which such schools are in session.

10 The Board of Education, upon recommendation of the
11 Director of Education, is authorized to establish attendance
12 areas within the public school system.

13 Any parent, guardian or other person having control or
14 charge of any such child between the ages of six and sixteen
15 years who fails to comply with the provisions of this section,
16 unless excused or exempted therefrom, is guilty of a misde-
17 meanor, and, is liable, for the first offense, to a fine of
18 not more than Ten Dollars (\$10), or to imprisonment for not
19 more than five (5) days. For each subsequent offense he is
20 liable to a fine of not less than Ten Dollars (\$10), or more
21 than Fifty Dollars (\$50), or to imprisonment for not less than
22 five (5) days, nor more than twenty-five (25) days, or to
23 both such fine and imprisonment."

24 Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
