AN ACT TO ADD CHAPTER 15 TO TITLE III, GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM RELATIVE TO DELEGATES TO NATIONAL CONVENTIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Chapter 15, Title III, Government Code of Guam, is hereby enacted to read as follows:

"CHAPTER 15

Selection of Delegates to National Conventions

Section 2800. Recognized political party-national convention. A recognized political party, affiliated with a national political party which holds a convention for the purpose of nominating candidates for President of the United States shall select delegates and alternates to such national convention. Such delegates and alternates from the recognized political party shall be chosen in the exact number authorized by the rules of such national political party.

Section 2801. Same--selection of delegates.

Belegates and alternates from the recognized political party to the national convention of such party shall be selected by secret ballot of such recognized political party at a meeting called by the Chairman on or before the first Tuesday of the fourth month of Presidential election years. The authorized representatives of the recognized political party who may so participate in the voting for delegates and alternates to the national convention shall consist of:

(1) All members of the Guam Legislature who are voters of the recognized territorial political party;

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(2) All municipal and assistant municipal commissioners who are voters of the recognized territorial political party;

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- (3) Certain persons chosen by the officers of such party, selected under Section 2009, from municipalities which do not have commissioners or assistant commissioners who are voters of that party as follows:

 For each municipal commissioner or assistant commissioner who is not a voter of the recognized political party, the officers of such party shall designate one voter registered in such party from such municipality;
- (4) Certain persons designated from the territoryat-large by the officers of such party, selected under
 Section 2009 of this code, in a number equal to the
 difference between the number of voters registered in
 such party who are members of the Legislature and the
 total number of authorized members of the Legislature;
- (5) The officers of the recognized political party selected under Section 2009 of this code;
- (6) The national committeeman and national committeewoman of the recognized political party who were selected
 at the next previous national convention or, in case no
 such selection was made, the persons designated by the
 officers of the recognized political party for those
 positions."

Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
