AN ACT TO ADD SECTION 8905.1 TO THE GOVERNMENT  
CODE OF GUAM TO SUSPEND THE USE OF FIREARMS BY  
THOSE CONVICTED OF VIOLATING THE GAME LAWS, AND  
TO AMEND SECTION 12323 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE  
OF GUAM TO MAKE CONSISTENT THE PENALTIES FOR  
THE UNLAWFUL POSSESSION OF EXPLOSIVES.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 8905.1 is hereby added to the Government Code/  
3 of Guam to read as follows:

4 "Section 8905.1. Same: temporary suspension. The  
5 privilege of owning, possessing or using any firearm in  
6 the territory of Guam shall be suspended for a period of  
7 one year following the conviction of any person over the  
8 age of 21 of his third violation of the game laws of the  
9 territory (Sections 12314, 12315, 12320 and 12321, Article  
10 1, Chapter 4, Title XIII, Government Code of Guam). The  
11 court having jurisdiction over such offender shall notify  
12 the Department of Public Safety of the third such conviction  
13 and any certificate of registration previously issued to  
14 such person shall be revoked and no new certificate issued  
15 for one (1) year."

16 Section 2. Section 12323 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby  
17 amended to read as follows:

18 "Section 12323. Penalty. Any person violating any  
19 provisions of this Article and supporting regulations shall  
20 be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof  
21 shall be punished by a fine of not more than two hundred  
22 fifty dollars (\$250.00), or by imprisonment of not less  
23 than fifteen (15) days nor more than ninety (90) days, or  
24 by both such fine and imprisonment. Provided that a

AN ACT TO AMEND THE VEHICLE CODE OF GUAM  
RELATIVE TO VEHICLE RIGHT OF WAY.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 23126, Government Code of Guam, is hereby  
3 amended to read as follows:

4 "Section 23126. Right of Way. (a) When two (2)  
5 vehicles are approaching or entering an intersection at  
6 approximately the same time, the operator of the vehicle  
7 on the left shall yield the right of way to the vehicle  
8 on the right except as otherwise provided in this title.  
9 The operator of any vehicle approaching or entering an  
10 intersection at an unlawful rate of speed shall forfeit  
11 any right of way which he might otherwise have hereunder.

12 (b) The operator of a vehicle approaching but  
13 not having entered an intersection shall yield the right  
14 of way to a vehicle already within such intersection or  
15 turning therein across the line of travel of such first-  
16 mentioned vehicle; provided, the operator of the vehicle  
17 turning across such line of travel shall have given a  
18 plainly visible signal of intention to turn.

19 (c) The operator of a vehicle within an inter-  
20 section intending to turn to the left shall yield the  
21 right of way to any vehicle approaching from the opposite  
22 direction which is within the intersection or so close  
23 thereto as to constitute hazard at any time during the  
24 turning movement and shall continue to yield the right

1 of way to such approaching vehicles until such time as  
2 the left turn can be made with reasonable safety.

3 (d) Said operator turning left having so yielded  
4 and having given a signal when and as required by this  
5 code may make such left turn and the drivers of all other  
6 vehicles approaching the intersection from said opposite  
7 direction shall yield the right of way to the driver  
8 making the left turn.

9 (e) The operator of any vehicle, upon approaching  
10 any 'yield' right of way sign shall yield the right of  
11 way to other vehicles which have entered the intersection  
12 from an intersecting street or which are approaching so  
13 closely on the intersecting street as to constitute an  
14 immediate hazard and shall continue to yield the right  
15 of way to such approaching vehicles until such time as he  
16 can proceed with reasonable safety. An operator, having  
17 so yielded, may then proceed and the operators of all  
18 other vehicles approaching the intersection on the inter-  
19 secting roadway shall yield the right of way to him."

20 Section 2. Section 23127, Government Code of Guam, is hereby  
21 amended to read as follows:

22 "Section 23127. Vehicle Entering Through Highway.

23 (a) The operator of any vehicle shall stop at the entrance  
24 to a through highway and shall yield the right of way to  
25 other vehicles which have entered the intersection from  
26 the through highway or which are approaching so closely  
27 on the through highway as to constitute an immediate  
28 hazard and shall continue to yield the right of way to  
29 such approaching vehicles until such time as he can  
30 proceed with reasonable safety.



1 (b) Said operator having so yielded may proceed  
2 and the operators of all other vehicles approaching the  
3 intersection on the through highway shall yield the  
4 right of way to the vehicle so about to enter or cross  
5 the through highway."

6 Section 3. Section 23127.1, Government Code of Guam, is hereby  
7 amended to read as follows:

8 "Section 23127.1. Private Road or Driveway.

9 (a) The operator of a vehicle about to enter or cross  
10 a highway from any private road or driveway or from an  
11 alley shall yield the right of way to all vehicles  
12 approaching on said highway.

13 (b) The operator of a vehicle intending to  
14 turn to the left into an alley, private road, driveway,  
15 or any private property shall yield the right of way  
16 to all vehicles which are approaching from the opposite  
17 direction and which are so close as to constitute a  
18 hazard at any time during the turning movement and  
19 shall continue to yield the right of way to such  
20 approaching vehicles until such time as the left  
21 turn can be made with reasonable safety.

22 (c) An operator having yielded as required by  
23 subsection (b) and having given a signal when and as  
24 required by this code may turn left and the drivers of  
25 all other vehicles approaching from said opposite  
26 direction shall yield the right of way."

27 Section 4. This Act is an urgency measure.
