AN ACT TO ADD SECTION 8905.1 TO THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO SUSPEND THE USE OF FIREARMS BY THOSE CONVICTED OF VIOLATING THE GAME LAWS, AND TO AMEND SECTION 12323 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO MAKE CONSISTENT THE PENALTIES FOR THE UNLAWFUL POSSESSION OF EXPLOSIVES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 8905.1 is hereby added to the Government Code/
of Guam to read as fellows:

"Section 8905.1. Same: temporary suspension. The privilege of owning, possessing or using any firearm in the territory of Guam shall be suspended for a period of one year following the conviction of any person over the age of 21 of his third violation of the game laws of the territory (Sections 12314, 12315, 12320 and 12321, Article 1, Chapter 4, Title XIII, Government Code of Guam). The court having jurisdiction over such offender shall notify the Department of Public Safety of the third such conviction and any certificate of registration previously issued to such person shall be revoked and no new certificate issued for one (1) year."

Section 2. Section 12323 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 12323. Penalty. Any person violating any provisions of this Article and supporting regulations shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not more than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00), or by imprisonment of not less than fifteen (15) days nor more than ninety (90) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment. AN ACT TO AMEND THE VEHICLE CODE OF GUAR BELATIVE TO VEHICLE RIGHT OF MAY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAR:

Section 1. Section 23126, Government Code of Guam, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 23126. Right of Way. (a) When two (2) vehicles are approaching or entering as intersection at approximately the same time, the operator of the vehicle on the left shall yield the right of way to the vehicle on the right except as otherwise provided in this title. The operator of any vehicle approaching or entering an intersection at an unlawful rate of speed shall forfeit any right of way which he might otherwise have hereunder.

- (b) The operator of a webicle approaching but not having entered as intersection shall yield the right of way to a webicle already within such intersection or turning therein across the line of travel of such first-mentioned webicle; provided, the operator of the webicle turning across such line of travel shall have given a plainly wisible signal of intention to turn.
 - (c) The operator of a vehicle within an intersection intending to turn to the left shall yield the
 right of way to any vehicle approaching from the opposite
 direction which is within the intersection or so close
 thereto as to constitute hexard at any time during the
 turning movement and shall continue to yield the right

of may to such approaching vehicles until such time as the left turn can be made with reasonable safety.

- (d) Said operator turning left having so yielded and having given a signal when and as required by this code may make such left turn and the drivers of all other wehicles approaching the intersection from said opposite direction shall yield the right of way to the driver making the left turn.
- (e) The operator of any vehicle, upon approaching any 'yield' right of way sign shall yield the right of way to other vehicles which have entered the intersection from an intersecting street or which are approaching so closely on the intersecting street as to constitute an immediate hazard and shall continue to yield the right of way to such approaching vehicles until such time as he can proceed with reasonable safety. As operator, having so yielded, may then proceed and the operators of all other vehicles approaching the intersection on the intersecting roadway shall yield the right of way to him."

Section 2. Section 23127, Government Code of Guam, is hereby amended to read as follows:

> "Section 23127. Vehicle Entering Through Highway. (a) The operator of any vehicle shall stop at the entrance to a through highway and shall yield the right of way to other vehicles which have entered the intersection from the through highway or which are approaching so closely on the through highway as to constitute as immediate hazard and shall continue to yield the right of way to such approaching vehicles until such time as he can proceed with reasonable safety.

(b) Said operator having so yielded may proceed and the operators of all other vehicles approaching the intersection on the through highway shall yield the right of way to the vehicle so about to enter or cross the through highway."

Section 3. Section 23127.1. Government Code of Guam. is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 25127.1. Private Road or Driveway.

(a) The operator of a vehicle about to enter or cross a highway from any private road or driveway or from an alley shall yield the right of way to all vehicles approaching on said highway.

- (b) The operator of a vehicle intending to turn to the left into an alley, private road, driveway, or any private property shall yield the right of way to all vehicles which are approaching from the opposite direction and which are so close as to constitute a hazard at any time during the turning movement and shall continue to yield the right of way to such approaching vehicles until such time as the left turn can be made with reasonable safety.
- (c) An operator having yielded as required by subsection (b) and having given a signal when and as required by this code may turn left and the drivers of all other vehicles approaching from said opposite direction shall yield the right of way."

 Section 4. This Act is an urgency measure.
