AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 4110 OF THE
GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM RELATING TO
OFF-ISLAND HIRE BY THE GOVERNMENT OF
GUAM.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 4110 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby
3 amended to read as follows:

4 "Section 4110. Overseas Differential. In the
5 event it is necessary or desirable to recruit officers
6 or employees for the government of Guam from the conti-
7 nental United States or other territory of the United
8 States, the Governor may, on all contracts executed after
9 July 1, 1951, authorize an overseas pay differential of
10 not to exceed twenty-five (25) per centum of the base
11 rate pay established for the position or for the class by
12 this Chapter. On all contracts executed after July 1, 1964
13 for such officers or employees recruited from the conti-
14 nental United States or other territory of the United
15 States, the terms thereof shall be not less than two
16 years. If, at the expiration of such two year contract
17 such officer or employee renews his employment by
18 executing another contract, and in lieu of returning
19 to his point of hire and then coming back to Guam under
20 the new contract, he elects to remain in the territory
21 without taking such leave, he shall be paid fifty per
22 cent of the transportation costs (excluding his vehicle
23 and household effects) the government of Guam would
24 otherwise have had to incur to return him to his point

1 of hire and then back to Guam, any employee making such
2 election to remain in the territory at the expiration of
3 his contract to so notify the government of Guam at least
4 sixty days prior to the time he would otherwise be returned
5 to his point of hire. Such pay differential shall be in
6 addition to allowances which may be provided for transpor-
7 tation of the employee, his dependents, and his household
8 and personal effects. Provided, however, that in no case
9 will any allowance which may be provided for transportation
10 as provided herein include an allowance for expense of
11 freight charges for shipment of automobiles or similar
12 vehicles, except that the following exceptions may be
13 allowed and authorized in connection with employees'
14 automobiles or similar vehicles:

15 1. An employee recruited outside of Guam (off-island)
16 may at the time of his recruitment be allowed to ship his
17 car, which has a market value of not less than \$500.00 to
18 Guam, provided, he is willing to underwrite or pay out of
19 his own personal account, one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of the cost to have
20 such car shipped to Guam.

21 2. An employee recruited off-island or outside of
22 Guam, owning a car in the United States, which has a market
23 value at the time of his recruitment, of not less than \$500.00,
24 may be allowed reimbursement or credit for any loss which he
25 may sustain in the forced sale of his car by reason of his
26 recruitment to Guam; provided that in no event, such reimburse-
27 ment or credit to an employee, be authorized for an amount
28 exceeding \$250.00.

29 (a) The amount of the employee's loss
30 on the forced sale of his car in the United
31 States will be determined and computed on the
