AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 4110 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAR RELATING TO OFF-ISLAND HIRE BY THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAR.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 4110 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 4110. Overseas Differential. In the event it is necessary or desirable to recruit officers or employees for the government of Guam from the contimental United States or other territory of the United States, the Governor may, on all contracts executed after July 1, 1951, authorize an overseas pay differential of not to exceed twenty-five (25) per centum of the base rate pay established for the position or for the class by this Chapter. On all contracts executed after July 1, 1964 for such officers or employees recruited from the continental United States or other territory of the United States, the terms thereof shall be not less than two years. If, at the expiration of such two year contract such officer or employee renews his employment by executing another contract, and in lieu of returning to his point of hire and then coming back to Guam under the new contract, he elects to remain in the territory without taking such leave, he shall be paid fifty per cent of the transportation costs (excluding his vehicle and household effects) the government of Guam would otherwise have had to incur to return him to his point

Such pay differential shall be in addition to allowances which may be provided for transportation of the employee, his dependents, and his household and personal effects. Provided, however, that in no case will any allowance which may be provided for transportation as provided herein include an allowance for expense of freight charges for shipment of automobiles or similar vehicles, except that the following exceptions may be allowed and authorized in connection with employees' automobiles or similar vehicles:

An employee recruited outside of Guam (off-island) may at the time of his recruitment be allowed to ship his car, which has a market value of not less than \$500.00 to Guam, provided, he is willing to underwrite or pay out of his own personal account, one-half (%) of the cost to have such car shipped to Guam.
- 2. An employee recruited off-island or outside of Guam, owning a car in the United States, which has a market value at the time of his recruitment, of not less than \$500.00, may be allowed reimbursement or credit for any loss which he may sustain in the forced sale of his car by reason of his recruitment to Guam; provided that in no event, such reimbursement or credit to an employee, he authorized for an amount exceeding \$250.00.
 - (a) The amount of the employee's loss on the forced sale of his car in the United States will be determined and computed on the
