AN ACT TO ADD SECTION 4233 TO CHAPTER 3,
TITLE V OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO
PROVIDE COVERAGE OF MEMBERS OF THE LEGIS-
LATURE IN THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM RETIREMENT
FUND.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 4233 is hereby added to Chapter 3, Title V
3 of the Government Code of Guam to read as follows:

4 "Section 4233. Coverage of members of the Legislature

5 (a) Except as may be otherwise expressly provided in
6 this section, the provisions of this chapter shall apply to
7 any person who has served as a member of the Legislature, or
8 who shall hereafter serve as such a member and any such person
9 shall be entitled to receive an annuity calculated in accordance
10 with Section 4211 of this title and based upon his years of
11 credited service as hereinafter provided.

12 (b) For the purposes of this section and of Section
13 4211 of this title, service as a member of the Legislature
14 during a regular session in any one calendar year shall be
15 deemed a full year of service as a member of the Legislature.

16 (c) Any person who has served as a member of the
17 Legislature or who shall hereafter serve as such a member
18 shall be entitled to receive credit as prior service for
19 all service rendered as a member of the Legislature or in
20 any other department, division, or agency of the Government
21 of Guam; provided, that in order to obtain credit for such
22 prior service as a member of the Legislature, a person

1 shall pay within five years after January 1, 1964, an
2 amount equal to One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) for each
3 year of service as member of the Legislature during the
4 period 1951 to 1964.

5 (d) In the case of any person who shall be a
6 member of the Legislature on January 1, 1964 or who shall
7 thereafter become such a member the annual average compen-
8 sation of such person for the purposes of this chapter
9 shall be considered as Nine Thousand Eight Hundred Eighty
10 Dollars (\$9,880.00) and the amount of contribution required
11 of such person for the purposes of Section 4218 of this
12 title shall be Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) annually.

13 (e) No provisions of this chapter or any other
14 Act relating to automatic separation from the service
15 shall be applicable to any member of the Legislature.

16 (f) As used in this section, the term 'Legislature'
17 means the Guam Legislature created by the Organic Act of
18 Guam, (64 Stat. 393).

19 (g) Notwithstanding any other provisions of this
20 section, the provisions of this chapter shall not apply
21 to any member of the Legislature until he gives notice
22 in writing, while serving as a member of the Legislature,
23 to the Board of his desire to come within the purview of
24 this chapter. Such notice may be given by a member of
25 the Legislature within six months after January 1, 1964
26 or within six months after any date on which he takes an
27 oath of office as a member of the Legislature; provided,
28 that any person who qualifies as a member of the Legisla-
29 ture for service prior to January 1, 1964, but is not
30 such a member on such date shall give notice in writing
31 within six months after January 1, 1964, to the Board of

his desire to come within the purview of this chapter.

(h) Notwithstanding any other provisions of this section, the provisions hereof shall not apply to any member of the Legislature who, while serving therein, is already receiving benefits under this chapter as a result of service in any other department, division, or agency of the Government of Guam."

Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
