AN ACT TO AMEND SUBSECTION (i) OF SECTION 20002
OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO AUTHORIZE THE
GUAM FINANCE AND DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION TO MAKE
HOUSING LOANS TO VETERANS.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Subsection (i) of Section 20002 of the Government Code of
3 Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

4 "(i) To encourage and engage in low-cost housing
5 activities, including development of residential subdivisions,
6 construction of housing for rental or resale, and to make
7 loans to any person for the purchase, construction, improvement
8 or repair of a home. First priority in making loans for the
9 purchase or construction of homes shall be given to resident
10 veterans of the Armed Forces of the United States who served
11 in either World War II or the Korean Conflict and were honorably
12 discharged from their respective branches of the service, to
13 enable them to purchase or construct permanent homes which are
14 typhoon resistant, such loans not to exceed \$14,000.00 and to
15 include therein both the cost of the land and of the building,
16 and if the veteran already owns the land involved, the loan
17 may still be up to \$14,000. The term 'veterans of the Armed
18 Forces of the United States' shall include veterans of the
19 Guam Combat Patrol, as certified by the Director of the Depart-
20 ment of Public Safety, and those person captured on Wake Island
21 during the Second World War or the survivors of those who were
22 killed, as certified by the War Claims Commission of the United
States."





AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 11814 OF THE
GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO PROVIDE THAT
STUDENTS GRANTED STUDENT LOANS MAY REPAY
THE SAME BY WORKING FOR THE GOVERNMENT OF
GUAM.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 11814 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby
3 amended to read as follows:

4 "Section 11814. Any student granted a loan under
5 this section shall agree to be employed by the government of
6 Guam for a period of years equal to the years of education
7 financed by such loan. Such students shall receive credit
8 toward repayment of all or part of such loan at the ratio
9 of three (3) years of employment by the government of Guam
10 in the profession or skill for which trained for one (1) year
11 of training under such loan."

AN ACT TO ADD A NEW TITLE XLIX TO THE GOVERNMENT
CODE OF GUAM RELATIVE TO CEMETERY FUND CONTROL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. A new Title XLIX is hereby added to the Government Code of
Guam, to read as follows:

"TITLE XLIX

Cemetery Fund Control

CHAPTER 1

Endowment Care Funds

Section 49300. Application of Chapter. This Chapter shall not apply to any public cemetery or to any cemetery owned or operated by any religious corporation, church, religious society or denomination or a corporation sole administering temporalities of any church, religious society or denomination nor shall it apply to any cemetery owned or operated by any non-profit firm, organization or corporation. Any other cemetery shall be an endowment care cemetery.

Section 49301. Cemetery authority defined.

'Cemetery authority' as used in this Chapter, means any person, firm, association, organization, partnership, business trust, corporation or company who establishes, owns or operates any cemetery subject to this Chapter.

Section 49302. Endowment care cemetery defined; deposits required. An 'endowment care cemetery' is one which has deposited in its endowment care fund the minimum amounts required by law and shall hereafter

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have deposited in its endowment care fund at the time of or not later than completion of the initial sale not less than the following amounts for plots sold or disposed of:

(a) One and 85/100 Dollars (\$1.85) per square foot of adult ground burial space; One and 25/100 Dollars (\$1.25) per square foot of infant ground burial space; and One and 50/100 Dollars (\$1.50) per square foot of any other ground burial space between adult and infant space;

(b) Ten Dollars (\$10.00) for each niche;

(c) Forty Dollars (\$40.00) for each crypt; provided, however, that for companion crypts, there shall be deposited Forty Dollars (\$40.00) for the first crypt and Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) for each additional crypt.

Section 49303. Same: additional deposit before disposition of plot. In addition to the requirements of Section 49302, any endowment care cemetery hereafter established shall also have deposited in its endowment care fund, the additional sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) before disposing of any plot or making any sale thereof.

Section 49304. Endowment care fund to be kept separate; commissions. The endowment care fund shall be kept separate and apart from all other cemetery funds. Separate records and books shall be kept of the endowment care fund. The amount to be deposited in the endowment care fund shall be separately shown on the original purchase agreement and a copy delivered to the purchaser. In the sale of cemetery property, no commission shall be paid a broker or salesman on the amount deposited by the purchaser in the fund.

1 Section 49305. Use of Fund. Endowment care funds
2 shall not be used for any purpose other than to provide
3 through income only for the endowment care of the cemetery.

4 Section 49306. Authorized investments. The endowment
5 care funds shall be invested, reinvested and kept invested
6 in:

7 (a) Bonds of the United States or of the
8 government of Guam or any agency thereof;

9 (b) First mortgages on improved real estate;

10 (c) To the extent to which shares or invest-
11 ment certificates are insured by the Federal Savings
12 and Loan Insurance Corporation, in shares or invest-
13 ment certificates of any savings and loan association
14 organized under the laws of Guam which is an 'insured
15 institution' as defined in Title IV of the National
16 Housing Act;

17 (d) Deposit in a bank which is insured by the
18 Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation.

19 Section 49307. Reports. Every cemetery authority in
20 charge of cemetery endowment funds shall file with the
21 Director of Finance annually on or before April 1st a
22 written report setting forth:

23 (a) The number of square feet of grave space
24 and the number of crypts and niches sold or disposed
25 of during the period covered by the report;

26 (b) The amount collected and deposited in the
27 endowment care fund;

1 (c) A statement showing separately the total
2 amount of endowment care funds invested in each of
3 the investments authorized by law and the amount of
4 cash on hand not invested, which statement shall
5 actually show the financial condition of the funds.

6 The report shall be certified as to its correctness
7 under oath by the cemetery authority preparing the same.

8 Section 49308. Examination of funds. The Director of
9 Finance shall examine the endowment care funds of a cemetery
10 authority:

11 (a) Whenever he deems it necessary and at least
12 once every five (5) years;

13 (b) Whenever a cemetery authority fails to file
14 the annual report required by this Chapter;

15 (c) Whenever it is requested by verified petition
16 signed by twenty-five (25) persons interested as lot
17 owners alleging that the endowment care funds are not in
18 accordance with the law.

19 Section 49309. Access to books and records. In making
20 such examinations, the Director of Finance:

21 (a) Shall have free access to the books and
22 records relating to the endowment care funds, their
23 collection and investment, and the number of graves,
24 crypts and niches under endowment care;

25 (b) Shall inspect and examine the endowment
26 care funds to determine their condition and the
27 existence of the investments;

28 (c) Shall ascertain if the cemetery authority
29 has complied with the provisions of this Chapter.

1 Section 49310. Injunctions. The Attorney General may
2 bring an action in the name of the government of Guam against
3 any person to restrain and prevent any violation of this
4 Chapter.

5 Section 49311. Punishment. Any person who shall wilfully
6 and intentionally violate any provision of this Chapter shall
7 be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall
8 be punished by a fine of not more than One Thousand Dollars
9 (\$1,000.00) or by imprisonment for not more than six (6)
10 months, or both. Violation of any order or injunction issued
11 pursuant to this Chapter shall constitute prima facie proof
12 of a violation of this section."

13 Section 2. Effective date. This Act shall be effective upon approval
14 by the Governor.

AN ACT TO ADD A NEW SECTION 9750.8 TO SUBCHAPTER Z,
CHAPTER 6, TITLE X, GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM, RELATIVE
TO COMPRESSED AIR.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 9750.8 is hereby added to the Government Code of Guam
3 to read as follows:

4 "Section 9750.8. Compressed air. Any equipment or
5 mechanical device used to process compressed air for breathing
6 shall be maintained and operated in such a manner so as to
7 prevent the contamination of the air so processed and sold.
8 The Director may order the owner, lessee, operator or the
9 owner of the premises where any such equipment or mechanical
10 device is located, to close down, cease to operate or remove
11 any such equipment or mechanical devices which he deems to be
12 dangerous to the public health, or take such other action as
13 may be authorized in accordance with law."

AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE GUAM CONGRESS
BUILDING MAINTENANCE FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE
30, 1965.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. The sum of \$33,073 is hereby appropriated from any available
3 funds in the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund for the Guam Congress Building
4 Maintenance for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1965.

5 Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
