AN ACT ADDING A NEW SECTION 62.1 TO THE GOVERNMENT CODE
OF GUAM RELATIVE TO TORT CLAIMS AGAINST THE GOVERNMENT
OF GUAM FOR PERSONAL INJURY OR DEATH.

1 Be it enacted by the People of the territory of Guam, That a new Section
2 62.1 is added to Chapter 2 of Title 1 of part 1 of the Code of Civil Procedure of Guam
3 as follows:

4 "62.1. Court claims of the government of Guam. The District Court of Guam
5 shall have exclusive jurisdiction of civil actions on claims against the government of
6 Guam, for money damages, not exceeding \$5,000 for injury to or death of one person in
7 any one accident and, subject to said limit as to one person, \$10,000 for injury to or
8 death of more than one person in any one accident, accruing on and after 1 October 1965,
9 for personal injury or death caused by the negligent or wrongful act or omission of any
10 officer or employee of the government of Guam while acting within the scope of his office
11 or employment within the territory of Guam, under circumstances where the government of
12 Guam, if a private person, would be liable to the claimant in accordance with the law
13 of the place where the act or omission occurred."
