Introduced by Alberto T. Lamorena

AN ACT CREATING THE GUAM RECODIFICATION COMMISSION. Be it enacted by the People of the territory of Guam, That there is created in the government of Guam the Guam Recodification Commission.

Section 2. Members. The Commission consists of the Attorney General of Guam, who is the Chairman of the Commission; the Judges of the District and Island Courts of Guam; the Chairman of the Committee on the Judiciary of the Guam Legislature; the United States Attorney of Guam; and the President of the Guam Bar Association.

Section 3. No compensation. The members of the Commission serve thereon without compensation.

Section 4. Contracts. The Commission may, with the approval of the Governor of Guam, enter into, amend, and terminate contracts with an established law-book publisher in the United States for the annotated recodification of the Codes and other laws of Guam.

Section 5. Duties. The Commission shall examine the common law, Codes, and other laws and judicial decisions of and relating to Guam for the purpose of discovering defects and anachronisms in the Codes of Guam; shall confer and cooperate with and make recommendations to said publisher on the revision of the Codes of Guam; and shall make recommendations to the Guam Legislature for the revision of the Codes of Guam.

Section 6. Title. This act may be cited as "The Guam Code Revision Act.
