AN ACT AMENDING SECTION 1716 OF THE CIVIL CODE OF GUAM
RELATIVE TO INCREASING THE AMOUNT OF THE CIVIL LIABILITY
OF PARENTS TO ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS.

1 Be it enacted by the People of the territory of Guam, That Section 1716
2 of the Civil Code of Guam is amended to read as follows:

3 "Section 1716. Civil Liability of Parents. The government of Guam,
4 the United States of America, its instrumentalities or agencies, any religious organi-
5 zation whether incorporated or unincorporated, any partnership, any association, or
6 any person, shall be entitled to recover damages in a civil action in an amount not to
7 exceed \$1,000 in the Island Court of Guam from the parents or guardians of any minor
8 under the age of 18 years, living with the parents or guardians, who shall steal or
9 maliciously or wilfully destroy or damage property, real, personal or mixed, belonging to
10 the government of Guam, the United States of America, its instrumentalities or agencies,
11 a religious organization, whether incorporated or unincorporated, partnership, associat-
12 ion, or person. Any person shall be entitled to recover damages in a civil action in an
13 amount not to exceed \$1,000 in the Island Court of Guam from the parents or guardians
14 of any minor under the age of 18 years, living with the parents or guardians, who
15 shall maliciously or wilfully commit any act resulting in personal injury to such person
16 or any minor child of such person. The recovery shall be limited to the actual damages
17 in an amount not to exceed \$1,000, plus taxable court costs; except, that the provisions
18 of this Section limiting the amount of damages recoverable shall not apply to Section
19 11408 and Section 23504 of the Government Code."
