AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 9115, SUBCHAPTER B, CHAPTER
2, TITLE X, GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM, RELATIVE TO
CHILDREN ELIGIBLE FOR PUBLIC ASSISTANCE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 9115, Subchapter B of Chapter 2, Title X,
Government Code of Guam, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 9115. Children. A child shall be eligible for
public assistance who:

(a) Is in need and has not sufficient income or
other resources to provide care and support compatible with
decency and health;

(b) Has not attained the age of eighteen (18) years;
or if enrolled as a full time student has not attained
the age of twenty-one (21) years;

(c) Is deprived of parental support or suitable
care by reason of the death, continued absence from home,
physical or mental incapacity, or cruelty, neglect or
depravity on the part of a parent; and

(d) Is living in a home with his father, mother,
grandfather, grandmother, brother, sister, stepfather,
stepmother, stepbrother, stepsister, uncle, aunt, first
cousin, nephew or niece, in a place of residence maintained
by such relative as his own home."
