AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 26200 OF CHAPTER 3, TITLE XXVII, GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM, TO REPEAL SECTION 26201, OF CHAPTER 3, TITLE XXVII, GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM AND TO ENACT NEW SECTIONS 26201, 26203, 26204, AND 26205 TO CHAPTER 3, TITLE XXVII, GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM, RELATIVE TO THE RELEASE OF A PORTION OF IPAO BEACH RECREATION PARK FOR SALE OR EXCHANGE FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A COMMERCIAL HOTEL AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. Subsection (k) of Section 26200, Government Code of Guam, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(k) Lot No. 5174 - C, Ipao Beach Recreation Park as delineated and described on Revised Land Management Drawing No. E4-60T498, Dated 24 January 1966 and recorded in the Department of Land Management as Document No. 64205."

Section 2. Section 26201, Government Code of Guam, is hereby repealed in its entirety and in lieu thereof a new Section 26201 is hereby enacted to read as follows:

"Section 26201. Prohibition.

Any person who shall injure or damage any government of Guam or private property or shall, in any manner, remove, destroy, injure, or deface any tree, shrub, plant, or other attraction of any nature, on or in any Government of Guam park, camp ground or recreational ground or shall violate any of the regulations pertaining thereto made by the Government of Guam shall be guilty of a misdemeanor."

Section 3. New Sections 26203, 26204, and 26205 are hereby added to Chapter 3, Title XXVII, Government Code of Guam, to read as follows: "Section 26203. Littering prohibited.

No person shall place, dispose of, or throw away any waste refuse, litter, or foreign substance in or upon any Government of Guam parks, except into receptacles provided therefor."

"Section 26204. Receipt and expenditures of donations. The Governor of Guam shall have the authority to receive in trust, any money or property of any kind or character, donated, granted, or bequeathed to the Government of Guam for park, camp ground or recreational purposes, and to carry out the terms, if any, of any such grant, donation of bequest, or in the absence of any terms of limitations, to expend the money or the proceeds of any such property as he may deem advisable for such purposes."

"Section 26205. Permits to individuals or associations for making park improvements. The Governor of Guam is authorized to grant permits to any individual, improvement club or voluntary association, or committees representing such clubs and associations, to improve, without expense to the Government, any Government of Guam park established under the provisions of this act."

Section 4. That former portion of the Ipao Beach Recreation Park excluded from said park by Section 1 of this Act may be sold or exchanged for the construction of a hotel if but only if any deed transferring said portion or any part thereof shall provide that the beach area thereof shall be reserved for the use of the general public and that the transferred land shall revert to the government of Guam if such hotel is not fully constructed and operating within three (3) years after the approval of this Act.
