AN ACT AMENDING SECTION 46003 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO EXEMPT FROM THE OPERATION OF THE MINIMUM WAGE AND HOUR ACT OF GUAM STUDENTS ENROLLED IN THE PUBLIC AND PRIVATE SCHOOLS OF GUAM DURING SCHOOL SUMMER VACATION.

1 Be it enacted by the People of the territory of Guam, That Item
2 4 of Section 46003 of the Government Code of Guam is amended to read as
3 follows:

4 "4. 'Employee' includes any individual employed by an employer,
5 but shall not include any individual employed: (a) at a guaranteed com-
6 pensation totaling \$350 or more per month, whether paid weekly, biweekly
7 or monthly; (b) in agriculture for any workweek in which the employer of
8 the individual employs less than ten persons; (c) in domestic employment
9 in or about a private home; (d) by his brother, sister, brother-in-law,
10 sister-in-law, son, daughter, spouse, parent or parent-in-law; (e) in a
11 bona fide executive, administrative, supervisory or professional capacity
12 or in the capacity of outside salesman, or as an outside collector; (f) in
13 the propagating, catching, taking, harvesting, cultivating or farming of
14 any kind of fish, shellfish, crustacea, sponges, seaweeds or other aquatic
15 forms of animal or vegetable life, including the going to and returning
16 from work and the loading and unloading of such products prior to first
17 processing; (g) as a seaman; (h) as a driver of a vehicle carrying passen-
18 gers for hire operated solely on call from a fixed stand; (i) as a golf
19 caddy; (j) by a non-profit school; (k) as a newspaper boy in the delivery
20 of newspapers to the consumer; (l) by a barber shop, beauty parlor, a
21 tailoring shop or any retail or service establishment employing less than

1 five (5) employees; (m) in any capacity if by reason of his employment
2 in such capacity and during the term thereof, the minimum wage which may
3 be paid such employee or the maximum hours which such employee may work
4 during any workweek without the payment of overtime, are prescribed by
5 the Federal Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938, as amended or as the same
6 may be hereafter amended from time to time; (n) in a non-profit workshop
7 for the handicapped; or (o) any student enrolled in a public or private
8 school of Guam employed during a school summer vacation."
