AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 15102 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM RELATING TO THE DUTIES OF THE WASHINGTON REPRESENTATIVE. WHEREAS, under the existing law, it is necessary for Guam's

Washington Representative to report in person to the Legislature each year, and

WHEREAS, although personal visits by the Washington Representative to the Legislature are important and desirable, it is nevertheless the consensus of the Legislature that no specific month be required for such personal visits so that the Washington Representative may be permitted to stay in Washington during the month of June when official business requires him to do so; now therefore BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. Section 15102 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby

amended to read as follows:

"Section 15102. Same: duties. It shall be the duty of the Washington Representative, elected as provided in Section 15100 of this Chapter, to establish and maintain an office headquarters in the Nation's Capitol for the purpose of full-time representation for the people of Guam at the United States Congress and with the various agencies of the Federal government on matters of local application to Guam including problems affecting Guam. He shall report in person to the Legislature during that portion of each annual regular session of the Guam Legislature which reconvenesson the second Monday of June. He shall actively advocate at Washington, D.C. all programs and policies duly adopted by the Guam Legislature."
