AN ACT AMENDING SECTION 11813 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM  
RELATIVE TO STUDENT LOANS.

1 Be it enacted by the People of the territory of Guam, That Section  
2 11813 of the Government Code of Guam is amended to read as follows:

3 "Section 11813. Student Loans. The Board is authorized to approve  
4 loans to qualified applicants for advanced education beyond the high school  
5 level which may be in an amount sufficient to reasonably cover all or any  
6 part of the cost of transportation, room and board, clothing, tuition, and  
7 other required fees for a period of one academic year in the College of Guam,  
8 or in an accredited college, university, or technical or trade school in the  
9 United States provided that any such loans shall not exceed Two Thousand  
10 Five Hundred Dollars per year and in no case shall the total amount loaned  
11 exceed that which the recipient needs to complete the requirements or degree  
12 or certificates issued upon graduation by the schools or institutions  
13 attended. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any full-time student,  
14 on regular status and having a grade average at time of application of not  
15 less than 'C' in financial need, and a bona fide resident of Guam, attending  
16 the College of Guam or an accredited college, university or technical school  
17 in the United States is deemed to be otherwise qualified to obtain a loan  
18 hereunder."
