AN ACT AMENDING SECTIONS 11806 AND 11807 OF THE GOVERNMENT
CODE OF GUAM RELATIVE TO PROFESSIONAL AND TECHNICAL SCHOLAR-
SHIPS.

1 Be it enacted by the People of the territory of Guam, That Section
2 11806 of the Government Code of Guam is amended to read as follows:

3 "Section 11806. Professional and Technical Scholarships. In order
4 to encourage the development of professionally trained people for service in
5 Guam, the following scholarships are hereby provided:

6 "(a) MEDICAL STUDENTS. Five students per year commencing 1
7 July 1965 to study medicine in colleges or universities within the
8 United States;

9 "(b) PHARMACY STUDENTS. Two students per year commencing 1
10 July 1965 to study pharmacy in colleges or universities within the
11 United States;

12 "(c) VETERINARY STUDENTS. Two students per year commencing 1
13 July 1965 to study veterinary medicine in colleges or universities
14 within the United States;

15 "(d) ENGINEERING AND ARCHITECTURE STUDENTS. Five students
16 per year commencing 1 July 1965 to study engineering or architecture
17 in colleges or universities within the United States;

18 "(e) ENTOMOLOGY STUDENTS. Two students per year commencing
19 1 July 1965 to study entomology in colleges or universities within
20 the United States;

21 "(f) AGRICULTURAL STUDENTS. Three students per year commencing
22 1 July 1965 to study agriculture in colleges or universities
23 within the United States;

"(g) LAW STUDENTS. Five students per year commencing 1 July 1965 to study law in colleges or universities within the United States;

"(h) EDUCATION STUDENTS. Twenty students per year commencing 1 July 1965 to pursue a course of study in education in colleges or universities within the United States;

"(i) DENTISTRY STUDENTS. Three students per year commencing 1 July 1965 to study dentistry in colleges or universities within the United States;

"(j) NURSING STUDENTS. Twelve students per year commencing 1 July 1965 to study nursing in colleges, universities, or schools of nursing within the United States;

"(k) COMMERCE AND BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION. Eight students per year commencing 1 July 1965 to study commerce or business administration in colleges, universities, or business colleges or schools within the United States;

"(l) GENERAL. Twenty-five students per year commencing 1 July 1965 for premedicine study, pre-law study, post-graduate study, and such other courses of which will, in the judgment of the Board, contribute to the growth, advancement, and development of Guam in Guam in colleges or universities within the United States;

"(m) TRANSFERS. If a scholarship provided in one field of study is not awarded because no qualified person has applied therefor, the Board may in lieu thereof award an additional scholarship in another field of study;

"(n) Said scholarships also shall be for study at the College of Guam in those fields of study set forth in this section which are offered by the College of Guam."

Section 2. Subsection (2) of Section 11807 of the Government Code of Guam is amended to read as follows:

"(2) The applicant, except in medicine and law, must present to the Board prior to the awarding of a scholarship satisfactory documentary proof that he has been admitted to a college or university to pursue a program of studies in the area of the scholarship applied for. An applicant for a schol-

AN ACT AMENDING SECTION 11811 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF
GUAM RELATIVE TO CONDITIONS ATTACHED TO CERTAIN SCHOLAR-
SHIPS.

1 Be it enacted by the People of the territory of Guam, That Section
2 11811 of the Government Code of Guam is amended to read as follows:

3 "Section 11811. Same: Conditions. Any person who receives a
4 scholarship under this Subchapter shall agree to be employed by the government
5 of Guam or to make himself available within Guam in the profession or field
6 in which he shall be educated for a period of years equal to the years of
7 education financed by such scholarship."
