AN ACT AMENDING SECTIONS 128 AND 190 OF THE PENAL CODE OF GUAM RELATIVE TO ABOLISHING THE DEATH PENALTY FOR FIRST DEGREE MURDER AND FOR PROCURING THE EXECUTION OF AN INNOCENT PERSON.

1 Be it enacted by the People of the territory of Guam, That  
2 Section 128 of the Penal Code of Guam is amended to read as follows:

3 "Section 128. Procuring the execution of innocent person.  
4 Every person who, by willful perjury or subornation of perjury, procures the  
5 conviction and execution of any innocent person, shall suffer confinement in  
6 prison for life."

7 Section 2. Section 190 of the Penal Code of Guam is amended to  
8 read as follows:

9 "Section 190. Punishment for murder. Every person guilty of  
10 murder in the first degree shall suffer confinement in prison for life; and  
11 every person guilty of murder in the second degree is punishable by imprison-  
12 ment from 5 years to life."
