AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 1000.5 OF THE
GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO CHANGE THE
ANNUAL COMPENSATION OF MEMBERS OF THE
LEGISLATURE FROM A SALARY PLUS PER DIEM
ALLOWANCE TO A STRAIGHT SALARY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 1000.5 of the Government Code of
Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 1000.5. Legislative compensation and
allowances. The compensation of each member of the
Guam Legislature shall be paid in twenty-six equal
installments at the rate of \$6,000 per annum; the
compensation of the Speaker of the Guam Legislature
shall be paid in twenty-six equal installments at the
rate of \$6,500 per annum. Such compensation and
allowance shall be paid out of funds to be appropriated

1 by the Guam Legislature."

2 Section 2. This Act shall take effect as of the
3 calendar year commencing January 1, 1967.

4 Section 3. This Act is an urgency measure.
