AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 25519, CHAPTER 6, TITLE
XVI, GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM, AND SECTION 397,
TITLE X, PART I, PENAL CODE OF GUAM, RELATIVE TO
THE SELLING OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES TO A MINOR.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 25519, Government Code of Guam, is hereby
amended to read as follows:

"Section 25519. Same: minors. Any person under the
age of twenty years purchasing alcoholic beverages or in
possession thereof shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and
upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of
not more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) or by imprison-
ment not exceeding three (3) months or by both such fine
and imprisonment."

Section 2. Section 397, Penal Code of Guam, is hereby amended
to read as follows:

"Section 397. Alcoholic Beverages, Selling Of, to Minors.
Every person who sells, gives, or delivers to any minor under
the age of 20 years, any alcoholic beverage as defined in
Section 25004, Title XVI, Chapter I, of the Government Code
of Guam, in any quantity whatsoever, shall be guilty of a mis-
demeanor, and shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by
a fine of not more than \$500 or by imprisonment for a period
not exceeding 90 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
Provided, that this section shall not apply to the parents of
such children, or to guardians of their wards."

Section 3. This Act is an urgency measure.
