AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 39100.1 OF THE GOVERNMENT  
CODE OF GUAM RELATIVE TO ELIGIBILITY FOR PAROLE.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 39100.1 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended  
3 to read as follows:

4 "Section 39100.1 Eligibility for Parole. Any person confined in the Guam  
5 Penitentiary, except persons under sentence of death or treason, shall be  
6 eligible for parole after he has served the minimum period of time of his  
7 sentence as prescribed by Section 39100 and as such minimum period of time is  
8 reduced by allowance of time for good conduct as hereinafter provided by this  
9 chapter; provided, that no person shall be eligible for parole unless he is  
10 serving a sentence or successive sentences of confinement in excess of six  
11 months; and provided further, no person shall be eligible for parole with  
12 respect to any sentence of confinement imposed pursuant to Section 1231(a)  
13 of the Penal Code of Guam."

14 Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
