AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 199 OF THE CODE OF CIVIL
PROCEDURE OF GUAM TO AUTHORIZE THE PROBATION OF-
FICER AND HIS ASSISTANTS TO SERVE AS PEACE OFFI-
CERS.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 199 of the Code of Civil Procedure of Guam is
3 hereby amended to read as follows:

4 "Section 199. Duties. The probation officer shall furnish to each
5 probationer under his supervision a written statement of the conditions
6 of probation and shall instruct him regarding the same. He shall keep
7 informed concerning the conduct and condition of each probationer under
8 his supervision and shall report thereof to the court. He shall use all
9 suitable methods, not inconsistent with the conditions imposed by the
10 court, to aid probationers and to bring about improvements in their con-
11 duct and condition. He shall keep records of his work, shall keep accu-
12 rate and complete accounts of all moneys collected from persons under his
13 supervision; shall give receipts thereof, and shall make at least
14 monthly returns thereof; shall make such reports to the Judicial Council
15 as it may at any time require; shall make presentence investigations
16 when directed by the court; and shall perform such other duties as the
17 territorial courts may direct. The Probation Officer and his assistants
18 shall each, in the course of carrying out their duties, have the powers
19 of peace officers under the laws of the territory of Guam."

20 Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
