AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 199 OF THE CODE OF CIVIL PROCEDURE OF GUAN TO AUTHORIZE THE PROBATION OF-FICER AND HIS ASSISTANTS TO SERVE AS PEACE OFFICERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PROPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 199 of the Code of Civil Procedure of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 199. Duties. The probation officer shall furnish to each probationer under his supervision a written statement of the conditions of probation and shall instruct him regarding the same. He shall keep informed concerning the conduct and condition of each probationer under his supervision and shall report thereof to the court. He shall use all suitable methods, not inconsistent with the conditions imposed by the court, to aid probationers and to bring about improvements in their conduct and condition. He shall keep records of his work, shall keep accurate and complete accounts of all moneys collected from persons under his supervision; shall give receipts thereof, and shall make at least monthly returns thereof; shall make such reports to the Judicial Council as it may at any time require; shall make presentence investigations when directed by the court; and shall perform such other duties as the territorial courts may direct. The Probation Officer and his assistants shall each, in the course of carrying out their duties, have the powers of peace officers under the laws of the territory of Guam."

Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
