



AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 11821, GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM,
RELATIVE TO ANNUAL SCHOLARSHIPS FOR VALEDICTORIANS AND
SALUTATORIANS OF GUAM HIGH SCHOOLS.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 11821, Government Code of Guam, is hereby amended to read
3 as follows:

4 "Section 11821. Students Entitled to Scholarship: Amount of Scholar-
5 ship. There are hereby established annual scholarships to the College of Guam, or to
6 any accredited college or university in the United States to include textbooks, tuition,
7 reasonable clothing, room and board, other school fees, and costs of transportation if
8 such college or university is without Guam, for a period of four years. Recipients of
9 such scholarships shall be the valedictorians and salutatorians of all high schools in
10 each graduating class of the public and private high schools in Guam. To be eligible
11 for the award of a scholarship granted under this subchapter, a student must be a U. S.
12 citizen and a bona fide resident of Guam for a period of at least two years immediately
13 preceding the date of the award thereof." In the event that any valedictorian or
14 salutatorian is ineligible because of his failure to meet the citizenship and bona fide
15 residency requirements, then the scholarship shall be awarded to the student next
16 highest in scholastic rank."

17 Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
