AN ACT

An Act to add section 8936.1 to the Government Code of Guam to prohibit the use of explosives in such a manner as to disturb the public peace.

Be it enacted by the People of the Territory of Guam:

Section 1. Section 8936.1 is hereby added to the Government Code of Guam to read as follows:

"Section 8936.1. Same: Disturbing the Public Peace. Every person is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for not more than six (6) months, or by a fine of not more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) or by both, who wilfully or recklessly or negligently uses explosives in such a way as to unnecessarily disturb the public peace, either by using charges of such size as to cause damage to adjacent property or to otherwise use explosives in such a way as to interfere with the comfortable enjoyment of life by a community or neighborhood, or by any considerable number of persons."

Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
