AN ACT TO RENUMBER SECTIONS 274, 275, 276, AND 277 OF THE CODE OF CIVIL PROCEDURE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM TO SECTIONS 278, 279, 280 AND 281, RESPECTIVELY, AND TO ADD NEW SECTIONS 274, 275, 276 AND 277 TO THE SAID CODE OF CIVIL PROCEDURE TO GREATE A JUVENILE CRIME PREVENTION BRANCH.

BE IT MUACTED BY THE PROPILE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Sections 274, 275, 276 and 277 of the Code of Civil Procedure of the territory of Guam are hereby renumbered Sections 278, 279, 280 and 281, respectively.

Section 2. A new Section 274 is hereby added to the said Code of Civil Procedure to read as follows:

"Section 274. Juvenile crime prevention branch; establishment of. The Director of Public Safety shall establish under his jurisdiction a juvenile crime prevention branch, to be maintained and conducted as hereinafter provided."

Section 3. Section 275 is hereby added to the Code of Civil Procedure to read as follows:

"Section 275. Duties and powers; reports. The juvenile crime prevention branch shall direct its attention specifically to the suppression, prevention and investigation of crimes committed by the children under the age of eighteen years, and any police officer shall have the power and authority to take and detain, for not to exceed six hours, any minor coming within the provisions of subsections (a) or (d) of Section 252 at the branch or other suitable places for guestioning and investigation. If it appears upon conclusion of such investigation that such minor does come within such provisions, he shall be referred to the Juvenile Court, and a written report of the findings of the officer shall be submitted to the court at the time of referral."

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Section 4. Section 276 is hereby added to the Code of Civil Procedure to read as follows:

> "Section 276. No limitations on Juvenile Court. Nothing in Sections 274 or 275 contained shall be construed to divest the Juvenile Court of any of its powers, but the same shall specifically grant to the police division of the Department of Public Safety the power to take, detain, question, investigate and refer to appropriate social or other agencies, private or governmental, as the facts of the case appear to justify minors coming within the provisions of Section 275, subject, however, to the provisions of Section 260." Section 5. Section 277 is hereby added to the Code of Civil

Procedure to read as follows:

"Section 277. Rules and standards; investigation and questioning; fingerprinting and photographing. The judges of the Juvenile Court shall make such rules and set up such standards of investigation and questioning as they consider necessary to guide and control the police in the handling of cases involving minors coming within the provisions of this chapter. Such rules and standards shall include limitations and restrictions concerning the fingerprinting and photographing of any child in police sustody. Such rules shall be enforceable as orders of the court."

Section 6. This Act is an urgency measure.

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
