AN ACT

An Act to add Chapter 12 to Title IX of the Government Code of Guam to require the registration of karate and judo experts.

Be it enacted by the People of the Territory of Guam:

Section 1. Chapter 12 is hereby added to Title IX of the Government Code of Guam to read as follows:

Chapter 12
Karate and Judo Experts

Section 8950. Registration Required. Any person who is an expert in the art of karate or judo, or any similar physical art in which the hands and feet are used as deadly weapons, is required to register with the Department of Public Safety.

Section 8951. Applicability. This chapter shall not apply to duly authorized and appointed peace and law enforcement officers, nor to members of the Armed Forces of the United States.

Section 8952. Registration. The Department of Public Safety shall register each karate or judo expert who applies therefor and shall keep a roster of such experts. On issuance of the registration certificate by the Department of Public Safety, the applicant shall bring such certificate to the License Division of the Department of Finance, which shall bill the applicant for the required fee. On payment of the required

fee to the Treasurer of Guam, the Treasurer shall receipt therefor on the face of the registration certificate and return such certificate to the applicant. The registration certificate with the receipt of the Treasurer marked on the face thereof shall constitute evidence of registration.

Section 8953. Fees. The fee for the registration of a karate or judo expert shall be \$5.00. Such registration shall be perpetual and need not be renewed.

Section 8954. Definition: Karate or Judo Expert. A karate or judo expert required to register by the provisions of this chapter, shall be a person trained in the arts of karate, judo, or other hand-to-hand fighting technique, whereby the hands, feet or other parts of the body are used as weapons, who shall have completed at least one level of training therein and shall have been issued a belt or other symbol showing proficiency in such art.

Section 8955. Penalty. Any person required by this chapter to register who fails to do so, or who registers but fails to pay the fee, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction thereof shall be subject to a fine of not more than \$1,000, or imprisonment for not more than one year, or both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 8956. Effect of Registration. Any registered karate or judo expert who thereafter is charged with having used his art in a physical assault on some other person, shall upon conviction thereof, be deemed guilty of assault with a deadly weapon and punished accordingly."

Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
