AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 26104, 26107, 26109 AND 26110 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAN TO INCREASE CERTAIN FEES IN CONNECTION WITH COCKFIGHTING, AND TO PERMIT ONLY ONE AMARA FRANCHISEE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 26104 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 26104. Cockpit: licensed. There may be established as hereinafter provided licensed cockpits in Guam. Provided, however, that there shall be two separate and distinct types of license issued as follows:

- (1) BALENTIA which authorizes the licensee to operate cockpit to engage in cockfighting only where knives or other sharp instruments are not used;
- (2) AMARA which suthorizes the licensee to operate cockpit to engage in cockfighting only where knives or other sharp instruments are used. There shall be only one licensed amara cockpit operation in the territory.

Section 2. Section 26107 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 26107. Same: Bids Must be submitted within a period of ten (10) days from the date fixed in the notice for the receiving of bids. Each bid shall be accompanied by a deposit of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) which shall not be returned and the amount of such deposits shall be paid into the Treasury of Guam. All bids must be sealed and will be publicly opened five (5) days after the expiration of the dates for receiving bids at the hour and place to be stated in the notice. The minimum bid which can be

received or accepted by the Board for the operation of the licensed amara cockpit shall be the sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) and for the operation of a licensed balentia cockpit shall be the sum of fifty dollars (\$50.00)."

Section 3. Section 26109 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 26109. Same: duration. All balentia licenses shall be for a period of two (2) years but may at the expiration of that time be renewed by the Board for an additional period of two (2) years upon the payment by the licensee of an amount equal to the amount of his original bid. The smara license shall be for a period of five (5) years but may at the expiration of that time be renewed by the Board for an additional period of five (5) years upon the payment by the licensee of an amount equal to the amount of his original bid."

Section 4. Section 26110 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 26110. No more than one license for the operation of a balentia cockpit shall be permitted in each municipality, village or area to which a commissioner or assistant commissioner has been allocated by the provisions of Section 15000 of Title XVI of this Code or as hereafter smended, and that the location of the balentia cockpit in each municipality, village or area shall be subject to approval by the Cockpit License Board. The amara licensee shall be permitted to operate in any or all of the municipalities of Guam, subject to the approval of the Cockpit License Board."

Section 5. This Act shall take effect upon the expiration of the term of the last smara license issued prior to the passage of this Act. The Cockpit License Board is not aut orized to issue or renew any smara licenses except pursuant to this Act and except that the Board may renew all smara licenses for a period up to the expiration date of the last such license issued. The Governor is authorized to promulgate by executive order the rules necessary to put into effect the amendments enacted hereby.
