Introduced by R. F. Taitano

AN ACT TO ADD SECTION 11802 TO THE GOVERNMENT  
CODE OF GUAM TO PROVIDE SCHOLARSHIPS TO THE  
COLLEGE OF GUAM TO CITIZENS OF THE TRUST  
TERRITORY OF THE PACIFIC ISLANDS.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 11802 is hereby added to the Government Code  
3 of Guam to read as follows:

4 "Section 11802. Scholarships for citizens of the Trust  
5 Territory. There are hereby established six annual scholarships to  
6 the College of Guam for citizens of the Trust Territory of the  
7 Pacific Islands, to include textbooks and waiver of tuition fees  
8 for a period of not more than four years. Each of the six districts  
9 of the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands is entitled to one  
10 scholarship per year, and recipients of such scholarships must be  
11 citizens of the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands and residents  
12 of the district to which the scholarship in question applies who  
13 have completed four years of high school or its equivalent. The  
14 Board shall elect annually the recipient of the scholarship from  
15 each district, such selection to be based on scholarship, aptitude,  
16 health, ambition and other criteria to be determined by the Board.  
17 The Board may also provide, on the basis of financial necessity,  
18 additional grants to apply to cover the cost of transportation to the  
19 College of Guam and return to the Trust Territory district in  
20 question upon completion of the student's program of study, and to  
21 reasonably cover the cost of room and board in the territory of  
22 Guam during the student's attendance at the College."

23 Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
