AN ACT TO ADD SECTION 11802 TO THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO PROVIDE SCHOLARSHIPS TO THE COLLEGE OF GUAM TO CITIZENS OF THE TRUST TERRITORY OF THE PACIFIC ISLANDS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 11802 is hereby added to the Government Code of Guam to read as follows:

"Section 11802. Scholarships for citizens of the Trust Territory. There are hereby established six amual scholarships to the College of Guam for citizens of the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands, to include textbooks and waiver of tuition fees for a period of not more than four years. Each of the six districts of the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands is entitled to one scholarship per year, and recipients of such scholarships must be citizens of the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands and residents of the district to which the scholarship in question applies who have completed four years of high school or its equivalent. The Board shall elect annually the recipient of the scholarship from each district, such selection to be based on scholarship, aptitude, health, ambition and other criteria to be determined by the Board. The Board may also provide, on the basis of financial necessity, additional grants to apply to cover the cost of transportation to the College of Guam and return to the Trust Territory district in question upon completion of the student's program of study, and to reasonably cover the cost of room and board in the territory of Guam during the student's attendance at the College." Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
