



AN ACT AMENDING SECTION 2205 OF THE GOVERNMENT
CODE OF GUAM TO MAKE CLEAR THAT NO CANDIDATE
MAY RUN FOR MORE THAN ONE LOCAL OFFICE AT ANY
ONE TIME.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 2205 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby
3 amended to read as follows:

4 "Section 2205. Same: Eligible for only one office. No
5 person shall be eligible for more than one office to be filled
6 in the same election, and may not file notice of candidacy for
7 more than one office, the term 'election' as used in this
8 Section to include a general and a local election held on the
9 same date so as to prohibit a person running for office in a
10 local election and in a general election at the same time."

11 Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
