AN ACT AMENDING SECTION 2205 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO MAKE CLEAR THAT NO CANDIDATE MAY RUN FOR MORE THAN ONE LOCAL OFFICE AT ANY CHE TIME.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 2205 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 2205. Same: Eligible for only one office. No person shall be eligible for more than one office to be filled in the same election, and may not file notice of candidacy for more than one office, the term 'election' as used in this section to include a general and a local election held on the same date so as to prohibit a person running for office in a local election and in a general election at the same time."

Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
