AN ACT TO ADD SECTION 4024 TO THE GOVERNMENT  
CODE OF GUAM TO PERMIT SABBATICAL LEAVE FOR  
COLLEGE AND EDUCATIONAL PERSONNEL.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 4024 is hereby added to the Government Code of  
3 Guam to read as follows:

4 "Section 4024. Sabbatical Leave. All teachers, vice principals,  
5 assistant principals, and principals of the Department of Education, and  
6 instructors of the College of Guam, who are permanent residents of the  
7 territory of Guam, may be given a sabbatical leave of absence upon com-  
8 pletion of seven consecutive years of satisfactory teaching service.  
9 To be eligible for such sabbatical leave, an employee must have obtained  
10 a baccalaureate degree or its equivalent, or be otherwise deemed of  
11 sufficient skill and experience to deserve such a leave. The Board of  
12 Education or the Board of Regents, as the case may be, shall determine  
13 eligibility for such leave and shall schedule the same in such way as  
14 not to unduly interfere with or disrupt the operations of the Department  
15 of Education or College of Guam, respectively. As a condition for the  
16 granting of sabbatical leave, the employee must, during the period of  
17 such leave, be engaged in endeavors related to his field of employment,  
18 and agree to return to his employment following such leave for a period  
19 of not less than two (2) years. 'Sabbatical leave' for the purpose of  
20 this section means twelve (12) calendar months of fully paid leave, and  
21 any accumulated regular annual leave must be included within and taken  
22 at the same time as the sabbatical leave."

23 Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
