



AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 20006 OF THE GOVERNMENT  
CODE OF GUAM TO INCREASE THE AMOUNT OF VETERANS  
HOUSING LOANS FROM \$14,000 TO \$16,000 AND TO  
EXTEND THE AVAILABILITY OF SUCH LOANS TO VETERANS  
OF THE WAR IN VIETNAM.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 20006 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby  
3 amended to read as follows:

4 "Section 20006. Direct Loans to Veterans. To assist in  
5 the housing needs of voting residents of Guam who are veterans of  
6 the Armed Forces of the United States, who served during the Second  
7 World War, during the Korean Conflict, or during the war in Vietnam,  
8 and who were honorably discharged from service, the Housing Cor-  
9 poration may make direct loans to such veterans. Such loans  
10 shall be made from the Housing Corporation's Guarantee Fund and  
11 upon such terms and conditions and under such rules and regulations  
12 as the Board may prescribe. It is the intent of the Legislature  
13 that such loans may be made to such veterans whether or not  
14 adequate financing is available on reasonable terms from a lending  
15 agency. No loan in excess of Sixteen Thousand Dollars (\$16,000)  
16 shall be made for the construction of a new home provided that up  
17 to Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000) of such amount may be used to  
18 purchase a homesite."

19 Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
